



Witch hunts still alive in Massachusetts!

6-year-old boy slammed with sex harassment allegations

Back on January 30, 2006, a 6-year-old boy was suspended from a Brockville, Massachusetts school for what some not-so-bright school officials claim was for “sexually harassing” one of the girls at his school.

The little boy just can’t figure out what he did that was wrong to get him punished and criminalized like this.

Court Watch called the boy’s school and was advised by the secretary that the boy was now attending another school.

What is so tragic is that a young boy’s life has been turned upside-down and his relationship with his school friends adversely affected. because of some grown ups who appear to have lost all sense of logic when dealing with these issues.

Of course, this is the kind of thinking that the citizens of Massachusetts used many years ago when they murdered women who they believed were witches.
